MANAGER'S REPORT: Ms. Ford summarized the status of the cultural resource consultants' work regarding Bridge 31.7. Currently, there is no update on whether the bridge is eligible to be listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The consultant has requested the previous bridge inspection reports and Ms. Ford sent those to him. Ms. Ford will keep the Commission updated as she learns more. Mr. Elwert has spoken with local historian Pat McKay who stated he could not imagine any reason it would be eligible to be listed. Mr. Walker requested that Ms. Ford let the Commission know as soon as she finds out from the consultant whether the bridge is eligible to be listed or not.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS: Mr. Sage reported that Rochester City Manager Nik Banda and the Fire Chief have stated the fuel tank and shed located in the Trail's ROW at the Dillman & Upton was removed. Mr. Sage asked how did we prove that it was on our property or not. Mr. Elwert requested a better description of whether it has been removed or just moved again. Mr. Sage stated it was moved again to a new location on the property. Ms. Ford determined the property line by measuring it in the field, as did Dillman & Upton, and says it is clearly visible in the property survey submitted with the fence plans. Chairperson Olijnyk would like to wait for a letter of response from Dillman & Upton acknowledging the move and if none is received, send a follow-up letter asking for an update. Mr. Walker would like to know why there are two tanks present now and has not seen evidence of the move and would like to discuss with Dillman & Upton when they attend the regular meeting in April. Chairperson Olijnyk thanked Mr. Sage for following up. Chairperson Olijnyk would like to know if any Commissioners will be able to attend the Pure Michigan Trail Designation award luncheon in Grand Rapids on April 11th at 11:50am along with at least one trail staff member. Commissioner Sage indicated he would reach out to Commissioner Gamage to see if she was interested in attending. Chairperson Oliinyk acknowledged that multiple applications have been received for the trail manager position and will be shared with the personnel committee as they are received.

Dear Ms Ford:

The Oakland Township Historical Society has a RR Signal Booth that used to sit alongside the Detroit and Bay City rail line that ran through Goodison and is now the Paint Creek Trailway. The structure contained communication devices to facilitate control of the switches that served the rail spur in the Goodison area. Several years ago local resident Danny Beer donated the RR Signal Booth and it was restored by Doug Caruso and his father. For the past several years it has sat under the roof at the front of the Cider Mill. The Society would like to refurbish (paint – possibly roof) the RR Signal Booth and move it to a location alongside the Paint Creek Trail with appropriate signage to describe its history and usage.

We propose to locate the RR Signal Booth at the Southeast corner of the point where the trail crosses Gallagher Rd. We would place the booth on a RR tie foundation situated in a bed of gravel about the size of the booth.

We would be happy to answer questions about this proposal and seek permission from the Commission to locate the RR Signal Booth alongside the Trail.

Subject: Dillman & Upton Date: April 13, 2023

In early March, the Commission sent a letter to Dillman & Upton requesting that they conform to the license agreement, including removing all hazardous material from Trailways property, including but not limited to the fuel tank that is partially on PCTC property, and that the hazardous material be removed in accordance with all local, state, and federal requirements. In reference to Dillman & Upton's request to extend the fence at the site, the Commission respectfully declined adding an additional structure on Trailways property, but encouraged the use of additional native natural plantings as a buffer between the parking lot and Trailway proper.

The Commission did not receive a direct written response back from Dillman & Upton and sent a second letter via email in early April requesting an update on the status of this matter. Following receipt of the letter, Brad Upton contacted Trail Manager Ford to let her know that Dillman & Upton has installed a new tank which was provided by their new fuel vendor. The old tank was recently filled by their old fuel company (final delivery) and once Dillman & Upton has used up the last of that fuel, the tank will be removed and the shed will be dismantled. The new tank will have a fence in front of it – installation TBD.

Additionally, Mr. Upton and Pete Mans, from Mans Lumber, plan attend the April Commission meeting to discuss the fence/natural screening with the Commission.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This will serve as a written understanding between the Friends of the Paint Creek Trail and Paint Creek Trail management regarding the roles and responsibilities of each organization and the support provided by each organization to the other.

Friends of the Paint Creek Trail

- 1. Provide volunteer and other support needed to Trail Management consistent with the Friends of the Paint Creek Trail's mission statement.
- 2. Coordinate public communications such as press releases, website, and Facebook posts with Trail management.
- 3. Issue letters of recommendation when appropriate to support Trail projects and grant proposals.
- 4. Maintain an appropriate supply of Trail-branded merchandise and have it available for purchase.
- 5. Observe and report Trail problems to Trail management and to the Paint Creek Trailways Commission when appropriate.
- 6. Monitor and care for the Moutrie Pollinator Garden and the adjacent service area.
- 7. Attend and participate, when appropriate, in Paint Creek Trailways Commission meetings, and keep Commissioners well informed regarding Friends' activities.
- 8. Organize events in conjunction with Trail management consistent with the Friends' mission statement and fundraising needs.
- 9. Serve as Trail ambassadors through interactions with the public and trail users.

Paint Creek Trail Management

- 1 Serve as the administrative headquarters for the Friends, including designation of Resident Agent.
- 2. Provide mail, telephone service, and meeting support, including space when available.
- 3. Provide a physical location for the storage of records equipment and the inventory of branded merchandise owned by the Friends.
- 4. Allow for the Friends bank account and debit card to be registered and retained at the Trail office.
- 5. Be the organizing entity for Trail events conducted by the Friends and support the event appropriately and to the extent permitted by resources.
- 6. Coordinate public communications that affect the Friends, such as press releases, website, and Facebook posts with Friends leadership.
- 7. Provide periodic and minimal administrative support to assist Friends management, including making copies for meetings, completing permit requests for events, documenting inventory, periodic merchandise sales, distributes Trail Magazines, deposits funds into Friends bank account, and other miscellaneous administrative services as needed.
- 8. Advocate for membership in the Friends organization through communications with the public.

Subject: Current Grants and Grant Opportunities for the Bridge 31.7 Replacement Project

Date: April 10, 2023

<u>Community Foundation for Southeast Michigan – Design & Access Fund</u>

The Commission received a \$50,000 grant from CFSEM for the Bridge 31.7 design engineering. The original grant period end date is April 21, 2023. At this time, there are still funds remaining as well as additional work that needs to be completed on the project.

Furthermore, AEW has indicated that whether we are awarded the TAP grant or not will impact the specifications they prepare for the project, as MDOT requires different formatting. We should know if we have received this grant in mid-July and AEW has indicated that they will need one month after the award notification date to complete the specifications.

Therefore, Trail Manager Ford requested a six-month extension for the grant so that this work can be completed and the remaining funds spent. CFSEM has granted the extension and the grant period has been extended to October 27, 2023 with a final report due November 27, 2023.

Oakland County Parks - Trailways and Park Improvements Grant Program

The city of Rochester received a \$25,000 grant from Oakland County Parks for the Bridge 31.7 design engineering. For the same reasons as listed above, Trail Manager Ford anticipates that the city of Rochester will also need to request an extension for this grant from Oakland County. The current grant period end date is May 19, 2023 for this project. Trail Manger Ford will speak with the city of Rochester DPW Director about requesting this extension.

<u>Michigan Department of Transportation - Transportation Alternatives Program</u>

Application for the TAP grant submitted. Tentative funding decision date is July 19, 2023.

The cultural resources consultant determined that the bridge does not meet the requirement for eligibility on the National Register of Historic Places and that the bridge replacement project will have no adverse effect on a historic property.

Trail staff shared the report with MDOT who indicated that they would upload the report to the Commission's application. The Technical Review meeting for this round of TAP funding is on April

26th and the TAP Grant Coordinator will turn around any comments/requests for revisions within a week.

The Section 106 review report completed by the consultants was also sent to SHPO for review.

<u>Michigan Department of Natural Resources - Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund</u>

Application for the MNRTF grant submitted. Final recommendations for funding by the MNRTF Board are in early December 2023.

<u>Michigan Department of Natural Resources - Michigan Spark Grants</u>

No new information at this time. Once our application's scores are available, I will be sure to share them with Commission. No date has been announced yet for the second round of funding.

<u>Community Foundation for Southeast Michigan - Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Trails</u> <u>Maintenance Fund</u>

Grant applications are due by May 15, 2023. Potential applicants are strongly encouraged to contact the program officer to discuss a proposed project before submitting a proposal. Grant decisions will be shared before the end of June.

Minimum grant request is \$50,000 - \$400,000 maximum. All Trails Maintenance Grants require a minimum 1:1 funding match (\$1 of Trails Maintenance Grant money for every \$1 from other sources).

<u>Michigan Department of Natural Resources - Fisheries Habitat Grant Program</u>

Commission can reapply for the grant in November 2023 if it wishes. Trail manager Ford will work with DNR Fisheries Division to get project/bridge listed on the 2023 Priority Habitat Conservation Projects List.

<u>Michigan Department of Natural Resources – Land and Water Conservation</u> Fund

The Trailways Commission decided not to apply for this grant as it is federal funds and cannot be used as a match for the TAP grant. The TAP grant requires that matching funds be from non-federal sources.

AEW completed the cost estimate for this project. They project that the construction cost will be approximately \$88,650. The engineer's opinion of costs follows this memo.

In addition to the observation deck, trail resurfacing, and access path to the river, there are a number of ancillary items that were suggested for the site. I have included the cost estimates for those items (plus an additional \$5,000 in contingency for cost overruns) in the spreadsheet after this memo for you to review. With these additional items included, the **estimated total cost for the project is \$170,733.40.**

I have forward the estimates to Andrea LaFontaine with the Michigan Trails and Greenways Alliance so that she can share it with the potential donor. I hope to have an update for you at the meeting.


Subject: Paint Creek Trail Brochures for MI Welcome Centers

The Paint Creek Trail Brochure has been approved to be distributed at MI Welcome Centers. The first round of distribution asks for 1400 brochures to be sent to the MDOT Distribution Warehouse. Each welcome center will receive 100 brochures to start. This allows them to see if there is interest in that area for our information. After the first year, brochures will be requested from the individual welcome centers that would like to receive more. This happens once a year (in December or January) as they restock. If the Commission does not wish to send the full 1400, the MDOT Distribution Center will evenly distribute whatever amount is sent.

Trail staff estimate that we have roughly 5000 brochures remaining from our last order and use around 2500 a season in the trail kiosks.

Advisory Committee Reports

The Friends of the Paint Creek Trail Ad-Hoc committee will present the Memorandum of Understanding that they drafted with Friends President Louis Carrio at the meeting. The Personnel Committee will provide an update on the preliminary interviews for the Trail Manager position.

Complaints/Vandalism

We received an inquiry from a trail user regarding when the trail will be graded this spring. Trail staff informed them that the trail will be graded once the freeze-thaw cycle is finished and the weather is regularly above freezing. We received a complaint from a cyclist regarding the bridle path at Gunn Road. The trail user requested that overhanging branches be trimmed and rocks removed from the path as they are a hazard to people on bikes using the path. Trail staff informed the user that the path is intended for use only by horseback riders and respectfully requested that user utilize the ramp on the Gunn Road stairs to walk their bike down to the trail. Trail manager Ford contacted Oakland Township Parks staff to trim the overhanging branches at the site.

Medical Emergencies/Police/Fire Calls on the Trail

I am unaware of any Medical Emergencies/Police/or Fire calls on the Trail.

Finances

- All Member Community invoices for 2023 Operations and Patrol have been received.
- 2023 license fees invoices to various utilities will be sent out following review of grants by the Trail manager for compliance with the conversion process and an update to the license.

Follow Up

- **Bridge 31.7 Design Engineering:** The cultural resource consultant determined that the bridge does not meet the requirement for eligibility on the National Register of Historic Places and that the bridge replacement project will have no adverse effect on a historic property.
- **Southeast Rochester Property:** There is an update on the status of this project in your meeting packet.
- Lake Orion Snow Removal: Trail attorney Hamameh spoke with the Village attorney who explained that since there is no snow removal on the trail at all, Lake Orion feels that that portion of the license agreement re: maintenance could not have intended to include snow removal. The Village have offered to "contract" for the service to remove snow from that

- portion of the trail, but the Commission would have to pay that cost. The Village attorney suggested that the Commission work out a cost with the DDA.
- **Pure Michigan Trail Designation:** Trail manager Ford and Administrative Assistant Grupido attended the Pure Michigan Governor's Conference on Tourism in Grand Rapids on April 11th to receive the Commission's award.





• **Trail to Trails Half Marathon:** Deanna Skelcy with Fast Dog Timing recently informed trail staff that they no longer plan to use the Paint Creek Trail for their event. They will now be using a route entirely in Macomb County.
