#### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairperson Olijnyk led the Commissioners, staff and those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

#### WELCOME TO NEW COMMISSIONERS

Chairperson Olijnyk welcomed the new members of the Paint Creek Trailways Commission, Conner Reiter and Stanley Ford. Everyone present introduced themselves.

#### AMENDMENTS TO AND APPROVAL OF AGENDA

MOVED BY ELWERT, SECONDED TO WALKER, to approve this evening's agenda as presented with the addition of an item to consider the minutes of the July 18<sup>th</sup> closed session meeting.

#### **GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT**

There was no one present who wished to comment on an item not already on this evening's agenda.

#### **CONSENT AGENDA**

This evening's Consent Agenda consists of the following: (a) minutes of the July 18, 2023, meeting of the Paint Creek Trailways Commission, and (b) Treasurer's Report for July 2023.

MOVED BY SAGE, SECONDED BY WALKER, to approve the Consent Agenda as presented, specifically to approve and file the minutes of the July 18, 2023, meeting of the Paint Creek Trailways Commission, and to receive and file the Treasurer's Report for July 2023.

#### **APPROVAL OF INVOICES**

Trail Manager Correll and the Commissioners reviewed the list of invoices dated August 15, 2023.

#### **SEMCOG GRANT APPROVAL FOR BRIDGE 31.7**

SEMCOG's Regional Review Committee has selected the Paint Creek Trail Bridge 31.7 Renovation project for Transportation Alternatives Program ("TAP") funding for fiscal year 2025. The total amount of this grant is \$721.210.42. SEMCOG adjusted the matching funds from 45 percent to 20 percent of total participating costs, waiving the city's local match and relying solely on the MDNR Trust Fund for matching funds.

Trail Manager Correll stated that he contacted our Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund ("MNRTF") grant coordinator to inquire about the status of our MNRTF grant application. The grant coordinator indicated that preliminary scores should be available in mid-September, after which time we may provide supplemental information. Final scores will be released after Thanksgiving, and then the applications will be forwarded to the MNRTF Board for consideration at their December meeting.

The Commissioners were very pleased with this news and are hopeful that we will be successful with obtaining our local match through the MNRTF grant.

#### "LIVING WALL"/PERPETUAL PLAQUE QUOTE

In response to the Commission's request at the July meeting, Administrative Assistant Grupido obtained four quotes for an additional plaque and for plate engraving for the "Living Wall"/Perpetual Plaque. She and the Commissioners reviewed those quotes as contained in her memorandum of August 10<sup>th</sup>.

Commissioner Becker proposed that we order the perpetual plaque and plates from The Trophy Shop in Lake Orion. While they did not have the lowest quote, all of the quotes were roughly similar, and he would like to patronize a business that is located within our Trailways member community.

The Commissioners reviewed the quote from The Trophy Shop. Ms. Grupido's memorandum indicates that the engraving is slightly different from what we currently have (etched vs laser), but it will be the same font.

MOVED BY OLIJNYK, SECONDED BY SAGE, to order a new perpetual plaque and plates from The Trophy Shop in Lake Orion as reflected in their quote. The Commission acknowledges that this was not the lowest quote, but the quote was roughly in line with other quotes received and the Commission wishes to support a business that is located within our Trailways member community.

Administrative Assistant Grupido was not certain how many additional plates we will need. Commissioner Gamage recalled that there is a document in the files that gives the criteria for including names on the Living Wall. Ms. Grupido will look into this.

#### PAINT CREEK JUNCTION PARK WAYFINDING SIGNS

The Commission needs to update the wayfinding signs along the Trail to better direct Trail users to Paint Creek Junction Park. Additionally, one wayfinding sign along the Trail has been damaged and needs to be replaced.

Administrative Assistant Grupido reviewed her memorandum of August 10<sup>th</sup>. The Rochester Sign Shop provided a quote for \$750.00 to update the graphics on two signs (the northbound sign and the southbound sign) to direct Trail users to Paint Creek Junction Park, and for the total replacement of a third sign (the damaged sign). They indicated that they are offering a discount if we do all three signs at once time; if we choose to do them separately, they will provide another quote.

The Commissioners reviewed the proofs of the graphics. Ms. Grupido noted that on the Paint Creek Junction Park signs, they should only include the arrow after the words "Paint Creek Junction Park" and not an additional arrow after the icons for the park amenities.

Commissioner Gamage said that we will also need to update wayfinding signage once the Bald Mountain Connector project is complete. Trail Manager Correll said Bald Mountain personnel have indicated a tentative completion date of spring 2024. Commissioner Gamage wondered what would be the best way to accomplish new or revised signage, potential timing for installation of the new signage, and whether Bald Mountain might cover the whole cost or a part of the cost.

After further discussion, the Commissioners agreed that they have a number of questions at this time. Administrative Assistant Grupido will obtain a quote for each of the three signs separately, as well as for the damaged sign and the southbound sign together indicating the Bald Mountain Connector. She will also ask for new proofs showing what the graphics will look like for each with space for the Bald Mountain Connector. Additionally, she will ask the sign manufacturer if they have any advice on how this information could be added at a later time.

#### **LICENSE AGREEMENTS**

Trail Manager Correll reported that our attorneys have spent approximately six hours of the eight hours that we authorized for them to work on this matter. He believes they have reviewed and revised as necessary seven of the eight license agreements.

The Commissioners discussed that once the agreements are complete, our staff should make the first contact with the licensees, and we can involve the attorneys later as necessary.

#### LABOR DAY BRIDGE WALK

The 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Labor Day Bridge Walk along the Paint Creek Trail will take place on Monday, September 4<sup>th</sup>, from 8 a.m. to 12 noon. The walk will begin at 9:00 a.m., starting at the Kiwanis Pavilion in Rochester Municipal Park. Trail Manager Correll said he will continue marketing the event over the next several weeks over social media, etc. Registration for this event is still open.

The Commission thanked Commissioners Elwert and Walker for soliciting sponsors and donations for this event. They briefly reviewed plans for the event. Commissioner Gamage asked if we have a photographer lined up; Chairperson Olijnyk said that we do not, but suggested that we ask former Trailways Commissioner and Oakland Township resident Frank Ferriolo.

Manager Correll said we are still looking for volunteers to help with this fun family-oriented event. Administrative Assistant Grupido will forward volunteer information to Commissioner

Dalrymple, who will let high school students in her school district know of this opportunity to earn community service hours.

#### FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT REQUEST

Trail Manager Correll reported that we received three Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") requests for information related to motorized vehicles on the Trail, and temporary use permits awarded by the Trailways Commission to allow Trout Unlimited to conduct work along the Trail. He worked with our attorneys to produce the information in a timely manner.

#### **ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT POSITION**

Administrative Assistant Grupido announced that she has submitted her letter of resignation. She applied and was accepted into a degree program and will be moving out of state. However, she said she can complete preliminary aspects of the program online, and is willing to work with the Trailways Commission to find and train a replacement.

Chairperson Olijnyk said she will meet with the Personnel Committee to review the job requirements and prepare a job posting for the position.

The Commissioners and Trail Manager Correll thanked Ms. Grupido for her time with the Trailways Commission, for being flexible with her end date, and for being willing to train her replacement. They wished her much success in her future career.

# **MANAGER'S REPORTS**

Trail Manager Correll reviewed his report of July 11th.

#### Complaints, Vandalism, Feedback

<u>Portable Restroom at Tienken Road</u>: A Trail user contacted Manager Correll and indicated that the portable restroom at Tienken Road needs attention. He forwarded this information to the City of Rochester Hills. The Trail users also shared how she and her family love using the trail and do so quite often.

<u>Unauthorized Pruning Along Trail</u>: Former Commissioner Hank Van Agen informed Manager Correll on August 4<sup>th</sup> of extensive pruning being done by an unknown person along the Trail along the spur property in Rochester. When the City of Rochester contacted the individual, he indicated that he removed a tree that had fallen across the Trail, and then cut invasive honeysuckle from the area. The individual stopped by the Trailways office after Trailways hours and spoke with Oakland Township Parks and Recreation Department staff, and left a note asking to be permitted to continue removing the invasives. Manager Correll called him and left a voicemail message asking him to stop this work and to call him back. However, Manager Correll has not heard back.

#### **Repairs and Maintenance**

<u>Dutton Road Construction</u>: The Dutton Road bridge construction has begun. Barriers have been placed on either side of the Trail in the area, so Trail access has not been affected. However, Trail users cannot access the parking lot there.

<u>Water Fountain at Tienken Road</u>: The water fountain located just north of Tienken Road is pooling water at the base. Rochester Hills has indicated that the repair work should be completed next week.

#### Medical Emergencies, Police, Fire Calls on Trail

<u>Ambulance Response for Bicyclist</u>: Our bike patroller reported that an ambulance was called on July 23<sup>rd</sup> to help a bicyclist between Gunn and Gallagher Roads. Manager Correll did not know details, but believes the bicyclist was experiencing either heat-related symptoms or suffered a cardiac event.

# Follow Up

<u>Recording Secretary</u>: Trail Manager Correll spoke with Recording Secretary Disipio. She will provide him with an update on her status on August 16<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Michigan Trails and Greenways Association</u>: Trail Manager Correll was invited to join the Michigan Trails and Greenways Association's discussion group on electric bicycles.

<u>Audit</u>: The audit was submitted to the State with the changes as directed by the Commission at last month's meeting.

Memorial Tree: Manager Correll was contacted by Carol Lee, a member of a running group. Their group leader recently passed away, and they'd like to plant a memorial tree near the Tienken Road trailhead. This is the group that planted another tree in the area previously. The group has indicated their willingness to water the tree until it is established (up to five years) as they did for the last tree, so long as it is close enough to a trailhead to allow easy access from their vehicles.

The Commissioners discussed that the municipality in which the tree would be planted would likely want to approve the type of tree, and noted that municipalities may have a list of acceptable tree species. They wondered if we had any type of signed agreement for the prior tree. Staff will look into this matter further, with the view that if approved, the tree would not be planted until the fall.

Orion Road Roundabout, Trail Crossing at Kern Road: The Road Commission for Oakland County is installing a roundabout at the intersection of Orion Road, Conklin Road and Stoney Creek Road. While the official detour takes drivers down an alternate paved route, many motorists are instead taking the back roads, including the area at the Trail crossing at Kern

and Clarkston Roads. Manager Correll said there is some confusion for motorists in this area, but he is also concerned about how this may impact the safety of Trail users. The Commissioners discussed and agreed to post extra signs along the Trail advising users to be extra careful at this crossing. Commissioner Gamage said she has seen brightly colored traffic cones at the Ludlow crossing, and suggested something colorful might catch the attention of Trail users.

#### **COMMISSIONER GAMAGE'S REPORT**

#### <u>Labor Day Bridge Walk – Photographer</u>

Commissioner Gamage said she was in contact with Frank Ferriolo and he has offered to photograph events at the Labor Day Bridge Walk.

#### **COMMISSIONER REITER'S REPORT**

#### **New Appointment**

Commissioner Reiter said he was recently appointed to fill the vacancy created by former Commissioner Ross's resignation. He is pleased to be part of the Paint Creek Trailways Commission.

#### **COMMISSIONER FORD'S REPORT**

#### **New Appointment**

Commissioner Ford said he is also pleased to be a new member of the Paint Creek Trailways Commission. He uses the Paint Creek Trail nearly every day. He said he is appreciative that the Commission is looking into one-wheelers on the Trail. Regarding the Labor Day Bridge Walk, he will share the word that we are still in need of volunteers for the event.

#### **SE Rochester Observation Deck with MTGA**

On August 30<sup>th</sup>, Trail Manager Correll met with MTGA Director Andrea Lafontaine, MTGA Board Member Neil J. Billetdeaux and Attorney Christopher Kroll regarding the Observation Deck project on the trail spur near Bloomer Park. MTGA and the attorney are eager to begin the project.

The attorney approved the estimated budget for the project and it was agreed that the process would work as follows: The Paint Creek Trailways Commission will sign a contract (provided in memo) with AEW as project managers for the Observation Deck. AEW will begin the project and submit invoices to the PCT for approval. Trail Manager Correll will forward approved invoices to MTGA, acting as fiduciary for the donor's funds, who will make payments to AEW (and other vendors as necessary) on the project.

The contract to begin development/design and engineering on the project is included in the packet.

Paint Creek Trail – Side Path Trail and Observation Deck

Dear Ms. Ford:

Thank you for the opportunity to quote Professional Engineering Services for the above referenced project.

#### **Understanding of the Project**

It is our understanding that the proposed improvement, the side trail, the resurfacing of 100 feet of shared use path and the observation deck were designed by Mannik Smith Group in 2019. Since the project was part of multiple projects that were assembled in one engineering plan set and project specifications, the 2019 bids for this project came higher than the estimated cost therefore the project was not constructed. Your office had shared the engineering plans and project specifications prepared by Mannik Smith Group and asked our firm to reassemble these documents and assist in the bidding process.

From our preliminary review of the engineering plans and some follow up on the permit's status, we noticed that some information are missing on Mannik Smith plans. The plan does not show a detailed design of the proposed observation deck such as structural design, height, deck location within floodplain and floodway, grading plan and it appears there was no submission to EGLE permit for working within Floodway and Floodplain. Our services to complete the engineering plan and project specifications will include a detailed review of the engineering plans, project specifications, reassembling the applicable plan sheets and projects specifications, provide the missing information and assisting in the bidding process. Also our service will include obtaining the required permits, generate project cost estimate and providing construction observation and administration.

#### Services to be Provided

The proposed services to be provided by AEW shall consist of the following:

• Performing topographical survey of the immediate area where the observation deck is being proposed to determine scope of work within the

floodway/floodplain. Also provide topographical survey of the side trial to ensure ADA compliance and maintaining positive drainage of the area.

- Review of the Mannik Smith engineering plan and Specifications
- Complete the missing information on the engineering plans to provide a complete engineering plan set such as footing design of the observation deck, grading plan, and prepare soil erosion plan, etc
- Obtain EGLE permit for working in floodplain and floodway and all required permits
- Commissioning and review of soil borings and geotechnical investigation, performed by others, soil borings will be necessary to determine type of soil and bearing capacity to assist in the footing design.
- Preparing construction cost estimate
- Limited construction observation
- Construction administration

#### **Additional Services Available**

The following services are available hourly upon request but not included in this proposal.

- Additional owner progress meetings
- Additional meetings with EGLE and other regulatory agencies
- Contractor bidding and award assistance
- Construction administration services beyond those listed under scope of services
- Construction staking and layout

#### **Services Not Provided**

### **Paint Creek Junction Signs:**

Rochester Sign Shop has quoted us \$750.00 for the total replacement of the middle junction sign that is currently damaged (bent and graphics torn as if something hit it), and for the update of the graphics on the north and southbound signs to better direct users to the Paint Creek Junction Park. To replace the signs individually would be \$300.00 each for the northbound sign, southbound sign, and the full replacement of the middle sign. To wait and replace the southbound and middle replacement together after the Bald Mountain Connector would be \$600.00. The total discount of doing all three together is \$150.00.

There are three options to add in the Bald Mountain Connector later on:

- 1. To be in the right spot mileage-wise they would need to leave a gap between locations to be filled in with a sticker that is either the whole phrase or individual white letters
- 2. They can print as is with the current locations and use a large sticker to cover and replace all the lines necessary to make sure it is in the right spot.
- 3. They can print a full sign sticker to cover everything.

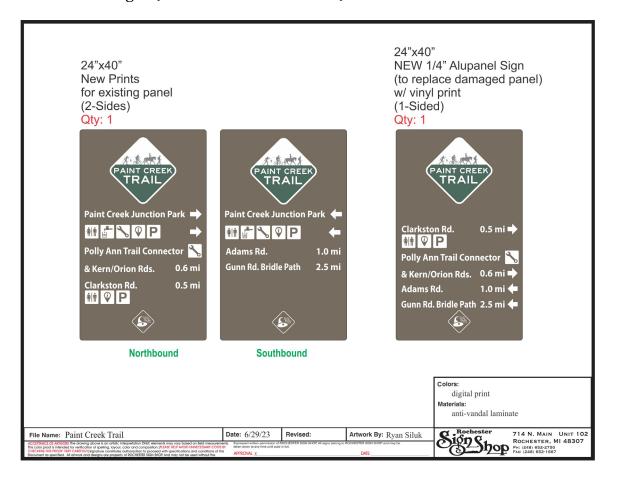
Note: All stickers will be raised above current printing and they have some concern about whether vandals will peel them off or that the signs will be sun faded before it is added and not quite match in color.

#### **Encroachment Notice**

On August 29, 2023, we received a report of a new encroachment on the Paint Creek Trail, near Flagstar Bank on the section between Gallagher and Silverbell Rds. A member of Oakland Township Parks and Recreation staff noticed a new path and stone staircase had been installed on Trailways Commission property.

Trail Manager Correll did a visual inspection on August 31st and was able to narrow down the owner's home to two addresses. Due to the encroachment's close proximity to the property line, trail staff was unable to ascertain the specific address, so notifications were sent to both homeowners via mail on September 12th, 2023.

# **Advisory Committee Reports**

 Personnel Committee – The Personnel Committee met to discuss the hiring process for replacing Administrative Assistant Grupido. Applications were open on September 14 and will be accepted until October 1, 11:59pm. Interview will take place over the next two weeks in time for the commission to approve the hiring of a new Administrative Assistant at the October 17<sup>th</sup> meeting.

- Labor Day Bridge Walk Committee The Labor Day Bridge walk was a successful day for the community with over 120 participants and over \$1,900.00 in donations between voluntary day-of donations and sponsorships.
- Licensing Committee New staircase encroachment was reported on 8/29 and verified on 8/30. Licensing committee requested a notice of encroachment be sent. Property lines were verified and documentation was prepared by Trail Manager and sent out the week of 9/12

# Complaints/Vandalism/Feedback

- A bicyclist reported slippery surfaces at the connector bridge to the Village of Lake Orion near the Orion Art Center, north of Atwater. Citizen was contacted by Trail Manager to clarify that although that was not technically part of the Paint Creek Trail, Village of LO DPW would be notified. I spoke with DPW Director Sanchez and notified him of the complaint.
- Vandalism/Graffiti Graffiti was reported near the Tienken Trailhead on 8/16 by Bike Patroller Butterworth. The graffiti was in the form of spray paint on the kiosk and other locations (see pictures below). Trail Manager Correll contacted Rochester Police and was directed to file a report with Oakland County Sheriff's Office. This was done in person at Tienken, case number 23-203636. A detective was assigned to the case and will keep us informed.









 A trail user requested right of way signage be posted at intersections. Used to be on old signs, but not on the newer Iron Belle signs

### **Repairs & Maintenance**

- Dutton Rd bridge construction is ongoing. Barriers have been placed on either side of the trail on Dutton road, so trail access has not been affected.
- Water Fountain on Tienken Scheduled for September 18 & 19

### Medical Emergencies/Police/Fire Calls on the Trail

• I am unaware of any emergencies on the trail.

# Follow Up

- I spoke with recorder Sandi Disipio over the phone on 9/12 and she informed me she will be unable to return to work as the PCTC recorder for the foreseeable future, due to a scheduled surgery. We will need to continue covering meetings through the remainder of 2023 with an alternate recorder, and find a more permanent replace going forward. Sandi has been with the PCTC since 1999 and was disheartened to leave, but wanted to make the decision in the best interest of the PCTC.
- Licensing Follow up info for Solaronics was sent to attorney after the August meeting. I have followed up to let attorney know the commission would like license agreements to be sent out early fall. Will have more information before October meeting
- Grants Mid-September we should have an update for the MNRTF Grant for Bridge 31.7
