Fishing

Fishing access is available along the trail. Please use stairs where available. A fishing license and trout stamp are required for persons over 16 years of age.

Horseback Riding

Horseback riders are welcome on the trail north of Dutton Road. **Riders are expected to** observe trail rules, are not allowed to trot or canter on the trail itself and are expected to clean up after their horses. If you you must go faster, please use the grassy sides of the trail.

Biking

Cyclists should adapt their speed to conditions and others on the trail, and should sound a bell or voice warning when passing. Bicycle racing and race training are not allowed. Class 1 and Class 2 e-bikes are allowed. Speed limit for all bikes is 15mph.

Trail Rules and Regulations


- No motorized vehicles

- Speed limit is 15 mph
